THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION (1) The Mayor and the Recorder are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Morse Brothers, doing business as LEBANON SAND AND GRAVEL for the construction of a levee around the City of Lebanon's existing sewage disposal plant in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore approved by the Common Council. The contract price to be 56¢ per lineal foot and \$47.19 per cubic yard of concrete in place, with a total estimated cost of \$5965.96. Said contract to be in the form presented by the Engineers for the City of Lebanon.

SECTION (2) That inasmuch as the flood season is rapidly approaching and there is a probability that an early flood will do great harm to the City's existing sewage disposal plant, therefore, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Lebanon that this levee be built forthwith, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
