AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION ON April 5, 1963, SUBMITTING TO THE VOTERS A BOND ISSUE FOR SEWERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. ORDINANCE BILL NO. 4

ORDINANCE NO. 1116

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> That there shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Lebanon for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in said City on the <u>5th</u> day of <u>April</u>, 1963, the following proposition:

The City of Lebanon is hereby authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) for the purpose of raising funds with which to construct a main trunk sanitary sewer line, which bonds shall be in such form; be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and the Council shall include in the annual tax levy hereafter, a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on the bonds hereby authorized as they become due.

Section 2. That the ballot title for the ballot shall be as

follows:

Shall the Charter of the City of Lebanon be amended by adding thereto Chapter XIII, providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds of the City in the sum of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) to provide funds with which to construct a main trunk sanitary sewer line, which bonds shall be in such form, be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and providing atax levy to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds?

<u>Section 3.</u> That the City Recorder is hereby authorized to publish notice of said election in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. That the polling places for said election shall be as follows:

Ward I. (Precincts I, II, & X) <u>Civic Room, Public Library</u> 626 Second Street, Lebanon Ward II. (Precincts III, IV, & IX) <u>Lebanon Jr. Hi. School, South entrance</u> 60 Main Street, Lebanon, Oregon Ward III. (Precincts V, VI, VII, & VIII)<u>City Hall, 925 Main Street, Le</u>banon <u>Section 5.</u> That the clerks and judges of said election shall be

Section 6. That the polling places for said election shall be open from the hour of 8 A. M. to 8 P. M. on said day and that the Chief of Police is instructed to place polling booths, pens, pencils and ballots for the purpose of providing for said election and the Recorder is directed to provide poll books therefor.

Section 7. That inasmuch as there is an immediate necessity for the funds that will be provided from the sale of the bonds herein mentioned, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Lebanon, therefore this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 5th day of March, 1963.
