A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OBJECTS WHICH OBSTRUCT THE VIEW AT INTERSECTIONS OF STREETS OR ALLEYS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. ORDINANCE BILL NO. <u>10</u> for 1963 ORDINANCE NO. <u>1122</u>

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of any real property in Lebanon, Oregon, to erect, place, maintain, suffer or permit to exist in that portion of the "Set Back" area which lies within fifteen (15) feet of any adjacent street line any fence, hedge, shrub, or other thing or projection over 42 inches in height, which obstructs the view of traffic on an intersecting street or alley. As used in this section height shall mean the vertical difference in elevation between the highest point of said obstruction, and the surface of the nearest street gutter. As to those streets where there are no gutters, the height shall mean the vertical difference in elevation between the highest point of the obstruction and a point six inches below the surface height of the nearest crown of said street.

Section 2. Inasmuch as the provisions of the Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
