AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1138, EXTENDING THE TIME FOR THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO INVESTIGATE THE APPLICANT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 1138 is amended as follows:

Section 2. Delete the period at the end of paragraph Section 4.

(b) and in lieu thereof add ", unless the Chief of Police has requested the City Recorder for additional time to investigate the applicant."

Section 3. Add additional language to Section 4. (c) so that the same shall read as follows:

"c) Where the application is endorsed "satisfactory" or (in those cases where the Chief of Police has not requested additional time) if 15 days shall have elapsed without the return of the application by the Chief of Police, the City Recorder shall then issue a license card addressed to the applicant for the carrying on of the business applied for. Such license shall contain the signature and seal of the issuing officer and shall show the name, address and photograph of the licensee, if such licensee shall not be a nonprofit organization, and the kind and goods to be sold thereunder, the date of issuance and the expiration date of the license. The City Recorder shall keep a permanent record of all licenses for a period of 2 years from the date of issuance."

Section 4. Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 3rd day of March, 1964.
