AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR CUSTODY BY THE CITY, DISPOSITION AFTER THE GIVING OF NOTICE, PROVINING FOR CHARGES AND FINES.

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 6 for 1964 ORDINANCE NO. 1145

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON:

Section 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person owning or having the care, custody or possession of any male or female dog of any age, to suffer or permit the same to run at large within the limits of the City of Lebanon.

Section 2. "To run at large" means to wander, to stray, to not be within the complete and adequate control of the owner or person accompanying or being responsible for the same.

Section 3. All dogs running at large/and/or not under the control of their owner or person responsible for the same, may be taken into custody by the City of Lebanon by its officers, and the fact of the taking of said dog, or dogs, shall be advertised by the posting of notice thereof for five (5) continuous days after the taking of said dog, or dogs, and by mailing of a notice thereof to the owner of the animal if known. If said dog remains unclaimed after five (5) days from the posting of the notice, then said dog shall be disposed of by the City of Lebanon, acting through its officers, as the City may deem proper. If said dog so taken into custody shall be claimed by the owner therof or person responsible therefor, within said time, said City may turn over said dog to said person so claiming same, upon payment to the City of the sum of \$5.00, and should the said dog be taken up a subsequent time as herein provided, before said dog can be redeemed a sum of money in an amount of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$25.00, the exact amount to be assessed by the Municipal Judge, shall be paid as hereinbefore provided.

Section 4. Any person knowingly permitting his dog to run at large shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00.
