AN ORDINANCE TAKING JURISDICTION OF

STREET IMPROVEMENTS ON SEVENTH STREET

FROM ROSE STREET TO GRANT STREET,

CLEVELAND STREET FROM ROSE STREET TO

ISABELLA STREET, AND ASH STREET FROM

THE END OF THE EXISTING PAVEMENT TO

WALNUT STREET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY)

ordinance bill no. 10 for 1964 Ordinance no. 1149

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Lebanon caused plans, specifications and estimates of the work to be done, to be prepared and filed in the office of the Recorder, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council thereafter approved the plans, specifications and estimates of the cost of making said improvements and by Resolution directed said improvements to be made and caused notice to make said improvements to be published in the manner provided by the Charter, and

WHEREAS, the time for remonstrances to be made to said street improvements has elapsed and no remonstrances have been made or filed herein, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Common Council of the City of Lebanon does hereby take jurisdiction of the proposed street improvement districts, to-wit: Seventh Street from Rose Street to Grant Street; Cleveland Street from Rose Street to Isabella Street; and Ash Street from the end of the existing pavement to Walnut Street, and orders that said street improvements be completed under the direction of the Superintendent of Public Works in accordance with the Charter of the City of Lebanon.

Section 2. Improvement warrants bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum evidencing the indebtedness for the construction of the above described improvements are hereby authorized, and said warrants shall constitute a general obligation of the City of Lebanon, and the Mayor and the Recorder are hereby authorized to issue said warrants to pay for said improvements when said payments shall become due, and said warrants shall be made callable as funds for the payment thereof shall become available and in any event not later than two years from the date of issuance.

Section 3. Existing conditions being such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared and said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 7th day of July, 1964.
