ORDINANCE BILL NO. 12
for 1964
ORDINANCE NO. 1151

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective July 1, 1964, the below named employees shall receive monthly salary increases (not in conformity with existing longevity ordinances) as follows:

Helen Borigo, Communications Clerk	\$10.00 per month;
Ellen Doyle, Communications Clerk	\$10.00 per month;
Don Davis, Fireman	\$15.00 per month;
David Teem, Police Officer	\$15.00 per month;
Karel Hyer, Police Chief	\$10.00 per month.

Section 2. Hereafter Communications Clerks, Helen Borigo and Ellen Doyle, shall receive longevity pay increases, (pursuant to Ordinance No. 1130) on the "Anniversary Date" of Junior Clerk Dorothy Warwick, instead of on their own Anniversary Date.

Section 3. Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
