ORDINANCE BILL NO. 24
for 1964

ORDINANCE NO. 1163

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate an ambulance service or business without first applying for and obtaining a license therefor from this city.

Section 2. The annual license fee for such business, pursuit, or occupation shall be \$ 100 per calendar year or part thereof, which shall include the use of one vehicle, and \$ 100 for each additional vehicle used in said business. Said license shall not be transferable and, if revoked, no part of said fee shall be refunded.


Section 3. Application for a license to operate such a business, pursuit or occupation, and for an increase in the number of vehicles to be used therein, shall be made in writing to the City Council of said city, and each application shall contain a statement, under oath, of the applicant as to his or its financial status and responsibility, the description of the equipment to be used and the type of service to be rendered. The Council shall have the right to demand further information and particulars concerning the applicant and the service proposed to be rendered, and shall be the sole and final judge of whether the applicant is properly qualified to enter into such business and render such service within the City of Lebanon. The Council shall also be the sole judge, during the existence of such license, to determine whether or not the license should be revoked. After consideration by the Council of an application, or the question of revocation of a license, the Council's decision thereon shall be final, and there shall be no appeal from the rejection of an application or revocation of any license by majority vote of the Council.

Section 4. Not more than one licensee shall be permitted to operate

an ambulance business in Lebanon at any time, unless a showing is made that an additional licensee should be permitted by reason of public convenience and necessity.

Section 5. Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
