ORDINANCE NO. 168

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> That there shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Lebanon for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in said City on the <u>19th</u> day of <u>FEBRUAR</u>, 1965, the following proposition:

)

The City of Lebanon is hereby authorized toisiue and sell general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000.00) for the purpose of raising funds with which to construct a main trunk sanitary sewer line extending from Eleventh Street and Oak Street to South Seventh Street, to South Second Street and to Russell Drive, with a large pumping station at Hansard Avenue and Harrison Street, and to acquire a site and install a small pumping station at South Main Street, which bonds shall be in such form, be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and the Council shall include in the annual tax levy hereafter a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on the bonds hereby authorized as they become due.

Section 2. That the ballot title for the ballot shall be as

follows:

Shall the Charter of the City of Lebanon be amended by adding thereto Chapter XV, providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds of the City in the sum of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000.00) to provide funds with which to construct a main trunk sanitary sewer line extending from Eleventh Street and Oak Street to South Seventh Street, to South Second Street and to Russell drive, with a large pumping station at Hansard Avenue and Harrison Street, and to acquire a site and install a small pumping station at South Main Street, which bonds shall be in such form, be dated and mature as determined by the Council; and providing a tax levy to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds?

<u>Section 3.</u> That the City Recorder is hereby authorized to publish notice of said election in the manner provided by law.

Section 4. That the polling places for said election shall be as follows:

Ward I. (Precincts 1, 2 and 10) - Civic Room, Public Library 626 Second Street, Lebanon Ward II. (Precincts 3, 4 and 9) - Lebanon Junior High School, South entrance, 60 Main Street, Lebanon Ward III. (Precincts 5, 6, 7 and 8) - City Hall

<u>Section 6.</u> That the polling places for said election shall be open from the hours of 8 A.M. to 8 P. M. on said day and that the Chief of Police is instructed to place polling booths, pens, pencils and ballots for the purpose of providing for said election and the Recorder is directed to provide poll books therefor.

<u>Section 7.</u> That inasmuch as there is an immediate necessity for the funds which will be provided from the sale of the bonds herein mentioned, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, therefore this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
