ORDINANCE NO. 1296

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. JUNK. The term "junk" shall include all old motor vehicles, old motor vehicle parts, abandoned automobiles, old machinery, old machinery parts, old appliances or parts thereof, old iron, or other metal, glass, paper, old lumber, old wood, or other waste or discarded material.

Section 2. It is hereby determined and declared that the keeping of any junk out of doors on any street, lot or premises within the City of Lebanon, or in a building that is not wholly or entirely enclosed except doors for use for ingress and egress, is a nuisance and is unlawful.

Section 3. On and after March I, 1968 it shall be unlawful for any person, or the agent or employee of any person, to keep any junk out of doors on any street, or on any lot or premises within the City of Lebanon, or in a building that is not wholly or entirely enclosed except doors used for ingress and egress.

Section 4. The provisions of this Ordinance shall not apply to junk kept in a duly licensed junk yard or automobile wrecking house.

Section 5. PENALTY.

- (a) Violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor:
- (b) Each day's violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 6. That existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and an emergency is hereby declared and said Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
