ORDINANCE NO. 1310

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: Section I. Establishment of Offices.

- (I) The offices of recorder, assistant recorder, treasurer, administrative assistant to the council, city attorney, city engineer, building inspector, health officer, fire chief, marshal, and superintendent of streets are established. The marshal shall be known as the chief of police and the superintendent of streets shall be known as the public works superintendent.
- (2) The offices of municipal judges for Department No. I and Department No. 2 of the municipal court and the office of municipal judge pro tempore are established.
- (3) The councils may combine any two or more appointive offices and may designate any appointive officer to supervise any other appoint—

 ive officer except a municipal judge in the exercise of his judicial functions.

Section 2. <u>Appointments</u>. A majority of the council shall appoint the officers to fill the offices established by this ordinance. The appointed officers shall hold office at the pleasure of the council.

Section 3. Oath and Bond. A person appointed by the council to fill an office established by this ordinance shall file an oath of office and give such bond as may be required by the council or he shall be deemed to have declined the office.

Section 4. <u>Duties</u>. The officers appointed by the council shall perform such duties as are now or hereafter prescribed by charter, ordinance, or order of the council.

Section 5. <u>Incumbents.</u> Officers previously appointed by the council and holding office on the effective date of this ordinance shall

continue to hold office until their successors are appointed and qualified, unless sooner removed by the council.

Section 6. Repeal. Ordinances No. 574, enacted January 5, 1943, No. 800, enacted January 3, 1951, No. 847, enacted November 17, 1952, No. 850, enacted January 6, 1953, No. 871, enacted November 3, 1953, No. 904, enacted June 21, 1955, and No. 1155, enacted August 7, 1964, are repealed.

Section 7. Emergency Clause. Inasmuch as the provisions of this ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
