ORDINANCE NO. 1402

WHEREAS a public hearing was held as provided in Ordinance No. 1400, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 222.120; and

WHEREAS, as provided in ORS 222.170, at least two-thirds of the landowners of the property described below, who also own at least two-thirds of the land in the territory, which represents at least two-thirds of the assessed value of all real property in said territory, have, prior to the public hearing, consented in writing to the annexation and have filed a statement of their consent with the City Council; and

WHEREAS, said real property is contiguous territory to the City of Lebanon;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following described property is hereby annexed to the City of Lebanon, Oregon, to-wit:

Tax Lot #700 as shown on Linn County Assessor's Map 12-2W-15DB (500 Airport Road); the South Half of Lot 1, Block 5, Harmony Subdivision; Lots 1, 2 and 3 in Block 3, Nichols Addition; Lots 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 in Block 2, Nichols Addition; the South 60 feet of Lot 6 and the South 60 feet of the west 10 feet of Lot 5, in Block 3, Mountain View Addition; and Tax Lots 2400 and 2501, Assessor's Map 12-2W-10BA.

Section 2. The City Recorder is hereby directed to make and submit to the Secretary of the State of Oregon a copy of this Ordinance, together with a copy of the statement of consent of the landowners in said territory, and also a copy of Ordinance No. 1400 declaring that no election shall be required within the City of Lebanon.
