THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2, subsection 7, of Ordinance No. 1222
(compiled as 6-3.2(7) is amended to read as follows, to-wit:

"7. For trucks coming from the South and proceeding to
the West:

North on South Main Street to Park Street;
North on Park Street to Oak Street;
West on Oak Street to Fifth Street;
North on Fifth Street to Tangent Street;
West on Tangent Street to city limits.

(a) Provided however, trucks weighing
less than 15 tons ~~shall~~ continue
West on Oak Street to city limits. "

Section 2. Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are
necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and
safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby
declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and
effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by
the Mayor.
