A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION ON JULY 16, 1976, SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF LEBANON: ORDINANCE BILL NO. 22 (1)A PROPOSITION AUTHORIZING A LEVY BY THE for 1976 CITY OF A TAX IN THE SUM OF \$ 543,502.00 OUTSIDE THE CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF ALL DEPARTMENTS OF THE GENERAL FUND: and (2) A PROPOSITION AUTHORIZING A LEVY BY THE CITY) ORDINANCE NO. 1603 OF A TAX IN THE SUM OF \$ 24,849.00 OUTSIDE THE CONSTITUTIONAL LIMITATIONS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF) PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE CONTINUANCE OF AMBULANCE SERVICE WITHIN THE CITY OF LEBANON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OFLEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. That a special election be held in the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, on the 16th day of July, 1976, for the purpose of submitting proposed tax levies in excess of the 6% constitutional limitation which is now on file in the office of the Recorder of the City of Lebanon, which has been proposed by the Council, and more specifically set forth as follows:

PROPOSITION (1)

Shall the City of Lebanon be authorized to levy a tax on property in the sum of \$ 543,502.00 outside the limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution, for the tax year 1976-77, to provide funds for the operation and maintenance of departments of the General Fund?

If this measure is approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the tax year 1976-77 will be \$ 162,638.00 greater than the operating budget financed by local taxes for the preceding year.

PROPOSITION (2)

Shall the City of Lebanon be authorized to levy a tax on property in the sum of \$ 24,849.00 outside the limitation imposed by Section 11, Article XI, Oregon Constitution, for the tax year 1976-77, to provide funds for the continuance of ambulance service in the City of Lebanon? If this measure is approved, the operating budget to be financed by local taxes for the tax year 1976-77 will be $\frac{1,729.00}{1000}$ greater than the operating budget for ambulance service financed by local taxes for the preceding year.

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<u>Section 2</u>. That the Deputy Recorder of the City of Lebanon is hereby authorized to publish notice of said election in the manner provided by law; and further she shall place said proposal on the official ballot to be voted on by the legal electors of said election.

<u>Section 3</u>. That the polling places for said election in the City of Lebanon shall be as follows:

Ward One - Precincts 0037, 0088, 0108 City Library Building 626 Second Street

Ward Two - Precincts 0038, 0039

First Baptist Church Gymnasium Corner Rose & Grove Street

Ward Three - Precincts 0040, 0041, 0079

Senior Citizens Center 585 Park

Section 4. That the Clerks and Judges of said election shall

be as follows:

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Ward Three - Judge - Bonita Wood Judge - Phyllis McCrae Judge - Shirley J. Nixon Clerk - Peg Vorderstrasse Clerk - Marge Lowe

Section 5. That the polling places for said election shall be open from the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. to 8:00 o'clock P.M. on said day and that the Chief of Police is instructed to take to the polling places booths, pens, pencils and ballots for the purpose of providing for said election and the Recorder is directed to provide poll books therefor.

Section 6. That inasmuch as the City of Lebanon will be without funds to maintain its services in the coming fiscal year unless the special election herein referred to can be held without delay, the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of th City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
