

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN  
PROPERTY FOLLOWING HEARING AND UPON THE  
WRITTEN CONSENT FILED WITH THE CITY COUNCIL  
BY LANDOWNERS IN SAID AREA, PURSUANT TO  
ORS 222.120 and ORS 222.170, AND DECLARING  
AN EMERGENCY.

ORDINANCE NO. 1614

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held as provided in Ordinance No. 1604, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 222.120; and

WHEREAS, as provided in ORS 222.170, more than half of the landowners of the property described below, who also own more than half of the land in said territory, which represents more than half of the assessed value of all real property in said territory, have, prior to the public hearing, consented in writing to the annexation and have filed a statement of their consent with the City Council; and

WHEREAS said real property is contiguous territory to the City of Lebanon,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The following described property is hereby annexed to the City of Lebanon, Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point North 89° 45.5' West 194.4 feet from the initial point of South Cedar Subdivision located in Section 22, Township 12, South, Range 2 West of the Willamette Meridian, Linn County, Oregon; thence South 0° 31.5' West 1565.80 feet to the South line of Vaughan Lane; thence South 89° 52.5' East 849.58 feet; thence North 0° 31.5' East 1564.07 feet to the south line of South Cedar Sub-division; thence North 89° 45.5' West 849.58 feet to the point of beginning, and containing 30.5 acres, more or less.

Section 2. The City Recorder is hereby directed to make and submit a copy of this Ordinance, together with a copy of the statement of consent of the landowners in said territory, and also a copy of Ordinance No. 1604 declaring that no election shall be

required within the City of Lebanon, to the appropriate State and County officials.

Section 3. Inasmuch as the provisions of this Ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Passed by the Council by a vote of 5 for and 0 against, and approved by the Mayor this 10<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1976.
