A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF LEBANON ON MAY 23, 1978 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE ELECTORS TWO PROPOSITIONS: THE FIRST PROPOSITION TO ADOPT OR REJECT A NEW CHARTER PROVIDING FOR A COUNCIL-ADMIN-INSTRATOR FORM OF GOVERNMENT AND REPEALING ALL PROVISIONS OF THE PRESENT CITY CHARTER, TO TAKE EFFECT JULY 1, 1978; THE SECOND PROPOSITION TO ADOPT OR REJECT AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER PROVIDING THAT THE VOTERS SHALL RESOLVE IMPASSES IN COLLECTIVE BARGAINING NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE CITY AND ITS EMPLOYEES, TO TAKE EFFECT JULY 1, 1978; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A special election shall be held on the 23rd day of May, 1978, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of submitting to the electors of the City of Lebanon two propositions: the first proposition to adopt or reject a proposed new Charter for the City providing for a Council-Administrator form of government and repealing all of the present provisions of the City Charter, to take effect July 1, 1978; the second proposition to adopt or reject an amendment to the City Charter providing that the voters shall resolve impasses in collective bargaining negotiations between the City and its employees, to take effect July 1, 1978.

Section 2. The BALLOT TITLE of Proposition #1 shall be as follows:

"A Proposition submitted to the legal electors of the City of Lebanon by its Common Council at a special election to be held on May 23, 1978, for the adoption or rejection of a new City Charter for Lebanon providing for a Council-Administrator form of government and repealing all of the provisions of the present City Charter, to take effect July 1, 1978."

Section 3. PROPOSITION #1 shall be as follows:

"Shall the proposed new City Charter providing for a Council-Administrator form of government be adopted and all of the provisions of the present City Charter be repealed, to take effect July 1, 1978?"

Section 4. The BALLOT TITLE of Proposition #2 shall be as follows:

"A Proposition submitted to the legal electors of the City of Lebanon by its common council at a special election to be held on May 23, 1978, for the adoption or rejection of an amendment to the City Charter of Lebanon changing the provisions for collective bargaining to include a provision for the voters of the City of Lebanon to resolve any impasses in negotiations between the City and its employees, such vote to be final and binding on all parties to the negotiations, to take effect July 1, 1978

Section 5. PROPOSITION #2 shall be as follows:

"Shall the City Charter of Lebanon be amended changing the provisions for collective bargaining to include a provision for the voters of the City of Lebanon to resolve any impasses in negotiations between the City and its employees, such vote to be final and binding on all parties to the negotiations, to take effect July 1, 1978?"

Section 6. The election polling places designated in the City of Lebanon by the Linn County Clerk for the state-wide election on May 23, 1978, are hereby designated as polling places for this special election; the poll books adopted for Lebanon by the Linn County Clerk as the poll books for said election are hereby adopted as the poll books for this special election; the Judges and Clerks of election appointed by the Linn County Clerk to serve in Lebanon at said state-wide election are hereby designated as the Judges and Clerks of and for the City special election.

Section 7. The polls for the City special election shall be open in each of the voting precincts during the same hours as the polls are open and closed for the said state-wide election.

Section 8. The City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to publish and post notices of said special election and propositions in the manner provided by law; and the propositions shall be placed upon the Official State Ballot or Special City Ballot, as may be permitted or required by law, to be voted upon by the legal electors

of the City at said election.

Section 9. Inasmuch as it is necessary to immediately prepare the materials for submission to the County Clerk, to post notices, and to prepare and distribute voters pamphlets, and this ordinance being deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
