ORDINANCE NO. 1793

WHEREAS, there has been filed with the City of Lebanon a written petition for the annexation of the area described below; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter of the City of Lebanon does not expressly prohibit the City from dispensing with submitting the question of annexation to the registered voters of the City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 222.120, the City Council has elected to dispense with submitting the question to the registered voters and in lieu thereof to declare the territory annexed by Ordinance following the public hearing on the questions, now therefor

THE PEOPLE OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A public hearing shall be held at 8:00 p.m. on the 27th day of August, 1980 in the Council Chambers of City Hall in the City of Lebanon, County of Linn, State of Oregon, before the Common Council of said City, at which time and place the registered voters of the City of Lebanon may appear and be heard on the question of the annexation of the following described area, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the South line of and South 89° 55' West 778.07 feet from a 3/4" iron bolt marking the Southeast corner of the Morgan Kees Donation Land Claim No. 43, Township 12 South, Range 2 West, Willamette Meridian, Linn County, Oregon; thence South 00° 05' East 528.13 feet to the Centerline of the Albany Santiam Canal; thence along said canal centerline the following courses and distances: North 58° 32' West 72.31 feet; North 32° 11' West 237.70 feet; and North 17° 23' West 302.62 feet to a point on the South line of said Claim No. 43; thence North 89° 55' East 277.93 feet to the point of beginning. Containing 2.15 acres more or less.

and whether or not the Common Council shall dispense with submitting the question to the registered voters of the City of Lebanon.

Section 2. The Recorder of the City of Lebanon is hereby directed to publish a notice of this hearing once weekly for two successive weeks prior to the day above set for the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Lebanon, and the Recorder shall post notice of the hearing in four public places in the City for a like period of time.

Section 3. Conditions are such that said annexation, if allowed, should be made within the near future, and, it being necessary for the peace, health and general welfare of the residents of the City of Lebanon that said hearing be held as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
