

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER
9.08 OF THE LEBANON MUNICIPAL CODE;
REPEALING SECTION 18 OF ORDINANCE 1800;
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.)

ORDINANCE BILL NO. 13
for 1984.
ORDINANCE NO. 1937

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LEBANON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 18 of Ordinance No. 1800, said Section having been enacted March 11, 1981, is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Chapter 9.08 of the Lebanon Municipal Code is hereby amended to add new Sections 9.08.020 and 9.08.030 as follows:

"9.080.020 Interfering in Emergencies

It shall be unlawful for any person to stop or remain in the vicinity of a fire, explosion, accident, riot or similar emergency or disaster, or where such an emergency or disaster is threatened, when his presence may be unsafe to himself or others, or may interfere with rescue, fire fighting or other emergency aid, after being notified by a peace officer or fire fighter to move to a place outside the area of danger or interference.

Violation of this Section shall, upon conviction, be punished as a Class B misdemeanor.

9.080.030 Interfering With Arrests.

It shall be unlawful for any person, by means of actual or threatened force, intimidation or deception, to prevent, obstruct or hinder, or to attempt to prevent, obstruct or hinder, the arrest or apprehension of a person who has committed a misdemeanor, violation or infraction. It is no defense to a prosecution under this Section that the principal offender is not apprehended, prosecuted, convicted or punished.

Violation of this Section shall, upon conviction, be punished as a Class A misdemeanor.

Section 3. It is necessary for the health, safety, comfort and convenience of the people of the City of Lebanon that his ordinance have immediate effect. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval"
