ORDINANCE NO. 1975

Section 2. Annexation Without Election. The City Council elects to dispense with submitting the question of annexation to an election by the registered voters of the City as authorized by ORS 222.120.

Section 3. Public Hearing. A public hearing on the question of annexation shall be held in Council Chambers of City Hall on July 10, 1985 at 7:45 P.M. at which time all interested persons may appear and be heard.

Section 4. Notice of Hearing. The City Recorder shall give notice of the hearing by publication once each week for two successive weeks before the day of the hearing in the Lebanon Express, a newspaper of general circulation within the City. The City Recorder shall cause notice of this hearing to be posted in four public places within the City for the same period of time.

Section 5. Conditions are such that said annexation, if allowed, should be made within the near future, and it being necessary for the peace, health and general welfare of the residents of the City of Lebanon that said hearing be held as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
