WHEREAS, there has been submitted to the City of Lebanon written requests for annexation to the City signed by more than one-half of the landowners who also own more than one-half of the land in the contiguous territory described below, which real property represents more than one-half of the assessed value of the land in the contiguous territory described below, which real property represents more than one-half of the assessed value of all real property in the contiguous territory to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, the City Charter does not expressly prohibit the City from dispensing with submitting the question of annexation to the registered voters of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Lebanon ordains as follows:

Section 1. Annexation Area. It appears that it is in the best interest of the City of Lebanon that the following contiguous territory be annexed: (See attached legal description).

<u>Section 2</u>. <u>Annexation Without Election</u>. The City Council elects to dispense with submitting the question of annexation to an election by the registered voters of the City as authorized by ORS 222.120.

Section 3. Public Hearing. A public hearing on the question of annexation shall be held in the Lebanon School District Administration Office Board Room on October 27, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. at which time all interested persons may appear and be heard.

Section 4. Notice of Hearing. The City Recorder shall give notice of the hearing by publication once each week for two successive weeks before the day of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within the city. The City Recorder shall cause notice of this hearing to be posted in four public places within the city for the same period of time.

Section 5. Conditions are such that said annexation, if allowed, should be made within the near future and it being necessary for the peace, health and general welfare of the residents of the City of Lebanon that said hearing be held as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared

	to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the
