WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish a procedure whereby personal property, other than abandoned vehicles, taken into custody by the City for any reason can be disposed of by making said property available to local non-profit, community based organizations; and

WHEREFORE the City hereby declares a public meeting establishing such a procedure;

NOW, THEREFORE, the people of the City of Lebanon do hereby ordain as follows:


Section 1: Chapter 3.08.030, "Sale-When" of the Lebanon Municipal Code, is hereby amended to read as follows:

At any time after the sixty day period referred to in Section 3.08.020, the Chief of Police shall sell at public auction any unclaimed property and any property which has been confiscated and not ordered destroyed, except such property held as evidence in any legal or Court proceeding. Notice of the time and place of sale shall be given once by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the City not less than ten days before the date of sale. The notice shall contain the description of the property to be sold. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City Administrator may determine, within his discretion, the disposition of any such items prior to sale, but not less than after the sixty day period hereinabove referred to. The disposition of any item shall be by any reasonable means, by donation or private sale, to any Lebanon community based organization which has been determined by the City Administrator to be a non-profit organization. In the event the City Administrator exercises such discretion, the City Administrator shall issue a Certificate of Sale in the same form as provided in Section 3.08.050 of this code.
