A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING LEBANON MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION2.24.040, TERM OF OFFICE FOR PLANNING COMMISSION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. ORDINANCE BILL NO. <u>26</u> FOR 2000

ORDINANCE NO. 2261

THE CITY OF LEBANON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u> Section 2.24.040 of the Lebanon Municipal Code concerning the term of office for Planning Commissioners is hereby amended to read as follows:

)

"2.24.040 <u>Term of Office</u>. Planning Commissioner terms shall commence on the first day of April, and shall be staggered in order to establish an approximately equal number of expiring terms every calendar year. The terms of commissioners in office at the effective date of this Ordinance shall remain unchanged by this Ordinance. Unless determined otherwise by the City Council, no commissioner shall serve more than two (2) consecutive four-year terms, but any person may be re-appointed to the commission after an interval of two (2) years. Service in excess of one thousand, four hundred and sixty (1460) days shall be counted as a full term in the case of persons appointed to fill unexpired terms and in the case of commissioners resigning."

Section 2. Emergency Clause. Inasmuch as the provisions of this ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Lebanon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
