Lebanon Oregon Aug. 18th 1885
 Council met in regular session

Called to order by the President

Roll call. Members present

Minutes of last meeting read and approved

On motion of Councilman Montague the Council proceeded to the consideration and adoption of Ordinance bill No 4 and relating to the repeal of ~~Sec~~ Ordinance No 4 and Secs 17 18, & 19 of Ordinance No 5 and the granting of license and collection of fees

After due consideration on motion of Councilman Montague further consideration of the bill was postponed to the next meeting of the Council

Quarterly report of S. H. Rasco Treasurer of Fire Department was presented and read. On motion the same was adopted and placed on file and a warrant ordered drawn on the Treasurer in favor of S. H. Rasco Treasurer for \$16.20 expenses of Fire Department

The Bill in case of Town of Lebanon vs J. A. Lomberson presented and read.

On motion of Councilman Montague the same was allowed and ~~a warrant~~ ordered drawn in favor of Recorder Marshal J. H. Johnston and A. J. Parker to the amount of \$6.00, Chairman of Ordinance Committee E. E. Montague reported the 3 Ordinances ^{bill} which had previously

On motion of Councilman Rusev a special Com be appointed to draft plans and specifications for the engine house and to consult the Building Committee President appointed. A. H. Rusev, J. W. Burkhardt and E. E. Montague ex officio members.

passed the 2nd reading and which had been referred back to Ordinance Committee, without recommendation.

On motion of Councilman Rusev the Ordinance bill, Relating to Levying a tax of 3 mills for building Engine house be passed to 3^d Reading, The same being read a 3^d time the question was put by the President, shall the Ordinance bill as read be passed. The roll being called the vote was as follows
