Lebanon Oregon Sept. 26th 1885Council met in special session at
Office of the President

voted to order by
the President. Roll call. L. H. Raberton Presid.

The President stated the object of
the meeting to be for the purpose of
settling some difficulties in regard to
the proposed Engine House also as
to sinking a well cistern

Mr. E. Grier being present, on report
stated that he moved sink a cistern at
his corner for the sum of \$85.00 8 feet in
diameter and as deep as possible making
the same in proper condition, to be paid
as follows \$20.00 in his subscription to
Engine and the balance to be paid
after all money for treasury and premiums
tax had been paid out.

Petition of citizens for the purchase
of Masonic Hall for Engine House
presented and read

Councilman

Burkhart moved that the same be
received and the building committee
be instructed to take the necessary steps
to see about the purchase of said hall
for an Engine house to report next
Wednesday evening at a special meeting
of the Council. Motion seconded by
E. E. Montague and being put tho

the chair was in doubt and asked the
roll to be called which resulted as
follows H. H. Rasco No
Joseph Ellins No
E. E. Montague Yes
J. W. Burkhardt Yes.

The vote
being a tie the President name was
called and voted No. The motion
was declined last.

On motion of
Councilman Rasco the Council
adjourned to meet next Wednesday
evening at the usual time to receive
a written proposition from the Masons
of the level they should take for their
Hall. Council adjourned to
meet next Wednesday evening
in special session.
