Lebanon Oregon Sept. 26th 1883

Council met in special session at
 call of the President

Called to order by
 the President, Roll Call, C. H. Kelson Presiding
 Present, Councilmen H. H. Resco, J. W.
 Burkhart, E. E. Montague & Joseph Collins
 present also Marshal & Recorder

The President stated the object of
 the meeting to be for the purpose of
 settling some difficulties in regard to
 the proposed Engine House also as
 to sinking another cistern

Mr. E. Guen being present, on request
 stated that he would sink a cistern at
 his corner for the sum of \$85.00 8 feet in
 diameter and as deep as possible making
 the same in proper condition to be paid
 as follows \$2000 in his subscription to
 Engine and the balance to be paid
 after all money in Treasury and persons
 tax had been paid out.

Petition of citizens for the purchase
 of Masonic Hall for Engine House
 presented and read

Councilman
 Burkhart moved that the same be
 received and the building committee
 be instructed to take the necessary steps
 to see about the purchase of said Hall
 for an Engine and to report next
 Wednesday evening at a special meeting
 of the Council, Motion seconded by
 E. E. Montague and being put the

The Chair was in doubt and asked the
roll to be called which resulted as
follows

J. W. Burkhead	Yes

The vote
being a tie the President's name was
called and voted No. The motion
was declared lost.

On motion of
Councillor Rasco the Council
adjourned to meet next Wednesday
evening at the usual time to receive
a written proposition from the Masons
of the West they would take for their
Hall. Council adjourned to
meet next Wednesday evening
in special session.
