Lebanon Oregon September 30<sup>th</sup> 1885.

Council met in special session according to previous adjournments called to order by the President

Roll call. Members present

C. H. Ralston President. Councilman  
G. H. Rasco. Joseph Elkins, J. W. Burkhart  
and E. E. Montague. Records present  
absent Marshal

Committee from  
Masonic Lodge composed of W. B.  
Donuca and G. W. Smith, submitted  
a written proposition to the Town  
Council for the sale of the Masonic  
Hall and ground and other articles to the  
Town of Lebanon for an engine house

Councilman Montague moved  
that the proposition be received and  
accepted and a committee be appointed  
to close the sale. The motion being  
seconded the same was put and  
declared a tie. The president ordered  
the roll of councilmen to be called  
and the votes recorded which  
was as follows

The result being a tie, the President  
C. H. Ralston voted on call of name  
No. The motion was declared  
lost. On motion of Councilman  
Montague the committee on fire and

Water were instructed to take the  
necessary steps for sinking a cistern  
at the corner of Vine and Main  
Streets. On motion the Council  
adjourned
