read and ^{on motion} granted.On Motion The Motion passed April
6, 1886. Viz. that all money then on
hands unappropriated and all money that
comes into the Treasury prior to Aug. 1st
1886. be held for the use of building Cis-
terns, was reconsidered.On Motion The Committee on Fire
and Water was instructed to proceed at
once to build such cisterns as the funds
of the Town will admit after paying
such bills as are now held against the
Town.On Motion Mr. G. M. Smith was added
to the Committee on Fire and Water.On Motion The Special Police on the 5th of July
was allowed \$4.00 per day.

1886. On Motion. A warrant was ordered drawn on the Treasury in favor of the Recorder for \$41.⁵⁰ to pay out standing bills.

On Motion. The Marshal was instructed to notify property owners in Block No. 3 to open the alley through said Block.
