

Lebanon Or Sept 20<sup>th</sup> 1892

Council met in regular session Roll called and Members all present except W. B. Doucass

Minutes of the adjourned meeting and last regular were read and approved

The Electric franchise of C. B. Rawlings was then read the 3<sup>d</sup> time as amended by the Ordinance Committee

And on motion duly seconded the Bill was passed the Council voting as follows:

James Boyles, yes; Joseph Elkins, yes and S. P. Baels yes

On motion the title of the Bill was declared the title of the Ordinance

The Water Power franchise of C. B. Rawlings was laid over to the next meeting

The Petition of W. E. Stardin and others for a sidewalk also crosswalk from Vine Street to Isabella Street on west side a distance of two blocks, was granted, and the Marshal was instructed to notify property owners of the same —

The Petition Parker and Grubb for a six months Retail Liqueur License was granted and the Recorder instructed to issue same when called for —

The Marshal placed a Communication from the State Board of Health which was read and ordered to be put on file and the Health Committee with the Marshal was ordered to examine Alleys and back yards of property owners, and all those that were not in conformity to Ordinances

were to be notified in writing to remove and clean said yards and Alleys

The Rules were then suspended and the Bill of J C Gordon of twenty dollars, for services as night-watch was allowed and a warrant on the Treasurer ordered drawn for same

The Council then adjourned to meet on the next regular meeting

Sebacon Or Oct-4<sup>th</sup> 1892

Council met at regular session Roll of Officers Called and all present except W. B Douaca

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved

The Marshal reported that he had served 40 nuisance notices and filed 37 of them in the Recorder's office and parties had not so far <sup>were being</sup> not prompt in obeying on account of not being able to get licensed teams to haul away their rubbish.

The Council then by motion duly seconded gave them an extension of ten days, and if said licensed teams could not be got, they could have the permission to get any teams

The request of Mrs Dixon for a cross walk on the north side of her property was granted and the Street Commissioner was ordered to put it down

The Council then ordered a new side walk to be put down from the north side of Board Hall on second
