The Marshal reported that he had served 40 nuisance notices and filed 37 of them in the Recorder's office and parties had not so far ^{were being} prompt in obeying on account of not being able to get licensed teams to haul away their rubbish

The Council then by motion duly seconded gave them an extension of ten days, and if said licensed teams could not be got, they could have the permission to get any team

The request of Mrs Nixon for a cross walk on the north side of her property was granted and the Street Commissioner was ordered to put it down

The Council then ordered a new side walk to be put down from the north side of Baud Hall on Second

(on the west side) to the north side of Ash Street -

Mr. Buhl and Pugh then made a proposition, in writing, to furnish the City Crosswalk and sidewalks lumber on the City lot at \$9⁰⁰ per M.

The Council then ordered 6070 feet at that figure and the written offer to be placed on file.

The Council by motion duly seconded appropriated seventy-five (75) dollars to be expended on the road that leads into the City from the South -

The written acceptance of C. G. Rawlings for Electric light-franchise was read and placed on file -

The Water franchise of C. G. Rawlings was laid on the table

The Report of the Committee on draining the McAlley Slough was accepted and a warrant ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the Balance of appropriation of \$100⁰⁰)

Rules were suspended and the following bills were allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the treasurer for the same A. G. Williams \$6-7⁰⁰ S. M. Garland \$18⁰⁰ and Jacob Are for \$1⁰⁰
