 Council met in regular session Roll
 called and Members all present

Minutes of the last meeting read and
 approved

The Water power franchise of C.G. Rawling's
 was laid over to the next regular Meeting

The Petition and Resolution of M.A.
 Miller's praying for the vacating of M.A.
 Miller's Addition to Lebanon, Linn County,
 Oregon was then read and on motion
 duly seconded, the following Resolutions
 adopted all of the Council voting for The
 Bill -

Resolution

Whereas, M.A. Miller is the owner in fee simple
 of all the Lots and Blocks of the entire M.A.
 Miller's Addition to Lebanon, Linn Co Oregon,
 Whereas all of said Addition is within the
 Corporate limits of the City of Lebanon, Linn
 County, Oregon

Whereas the said M.A. Miller being desirous of
 vacating the whole of said addition, and has
 complied strictly with the Laws of the State of
 Oregon, and of the Ordinances of the City of
 Lebanon, in reference to the vacation of Lots
 blocks, Streets and Additions, and there being
 no objections to the proposed vacation and all
 persons having property adjacent thereto and all parties interested
 have been duly notified and their objections heard and no objection
 has been filed with the Recorder of the City of Lebanon, Oregon,
 Therefore be it and it is hereby ordered that
 the said Addition, Lots and Blocks known as
 M.A. Miller's Addition to Lebanon, Linn County,
 Oregon, as the same appears on record in the
 Recorder's office for Linn County, Oregon, and in
 the petition and notices now on file with the
 Recorder of Lebanon, Oregon, be and the same
 is hereby vacated and this order shall be
 placed upon the record of the City of Lebanon
 Linn County, Oregon. -

and has duly filed, as by Law required a petition duly verified and signed by himself, setting forth all facts required to be set forth in such petition and has duly posted, as by law required the notices, and has filed herewith one of said notices, with an affidavit showing that the same were duly posted as by Law required, —

Bill No 28 was then read the first time and on motion read the second time by title and referred to Committee on Ordinances for Amendment

On Motion the petition of Mr Ayers and others for a Crosswalk was granted

Mr Rawlings of the Lebanon Electric Light being present, presented the following Resolution for their consideration of the City Council —

"Whereas the City of Lebanon needs better lights than it now, Therefore be it and it is hereby resolved that the City enter into a contract with the Lebanon Electric Light and Water power Company, if agreeable to said Company as follows:

Said Company to furnish to said City, at places to be by said City designated and changed at the pleasure of said City, and at expense of said City, Five (5) Electric Arch lights, all of which shall burn and be kept in good Condition from dusk till day light, of each day at the agreed price of ten (10) dollars per light per month, to be paid at expiration of each month, but if not paid then warrants for such price shall bear eight (8) per cent interest from date of issue till paid. The Contract to be binding for five years from date of execution, with the privilege to the City of extending said contract on said terms

for fifteen years from expiration of said original contract"

On motion of Joseph Elkins, duly seconded by S. P. Bach the resolution was duly passed and adopted ^{all of} The Council voting for the Resolution

The Rules were then suspended and the following Bills against the City were allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the same, J^r & Gordon, \$20⁰⁰ and Geo. W. Rice \$125 -

The Council then adjourned to meet at its next regular meeting
