

Lebanon Or Nov 1st 1892

Council met in regular session Roll called and officers all present

Minutes of the last meeting read and approved

The Committee on Ordinances reported on Bill No 28 and recommended the passage of the Bill as amended on motion the their report was accepted and ordered to be placed on file

The petition of J B Springer and others for crosswalks and a sidewalk was granted and the Marshal instructed to notify property owners to comply within thirty days

The Petition of G B Hausard and Hamilton was allowed and parties to be notified to put down said walks

The request of G P Cotton for a sidewalk from 2nd street on the south side of Vine across Railroad was granted

On motion the property owners on the west side of Main from the South side of Oak street to Lebanon and Saultaine Canal were ordered to put down an eight foot sidewalk

Bill No 29 was then read the 1st time and on motion was read the 2nd time by title

On Motion the Rules were suspended all members voting for the suspension, and on motion the Bill was put to the 3^d reading and final passage. The Council all voting in the affirmative for the passage of the Bill

On motion duly seconded the title of the Bill was declared the title of the Ordinance

Bill No 28 was then read the 3^d time and on motion was duly passed. The whole of the Council voting for the Bill.

On Motion the title of Bill was declared the title of the Ordinance.

The resignation of A. G. Williams was then read and on motion was accepted and to take effect at the next regular meeting.

On motion the City Recorder was authorized to draw warrants on the Treasurer in favor of Smith & Westfall for forty dollars and John Scandling for twenty dollars as rebate and refunding of Truck and delivery wagon license.

On motion the rules were suspended and the following Bills allowed A. G. Williams \$40⁰⁰ and H. Y. Kirkpatrick for \$3¹⁵ warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for same.
