

## Council Chamber.

Aug. 15<sup>th</sup> 1893.

Council met in regular session, Roll was called. The Mayor and all councilmen present: except G. M. Westfall. Minutes of last previous meeting read and approved. The Road & Street Committee reported that the Bridge, heretofore ordered at the South end of Main Street, had been satisfactorily completed. Whereupon, the Council, by motion, accepted and approved the said Bridge.

Resolution <sup>and Order</sup> No. 2, relating to the construction of side-walks heretofore described in Resolution <sup>and Order</sup> No. 1 and in the notice duly published heretofore thereunder, was adopted by the following vote:

The resolution and order is No. 2, and is as follows:

" Resolution and Order No. 2

A time having been heretofore fixed, or shown, shall by Resolution and Order No. 1, the reasons and determining of all objections and amendments to the construction of the side-walks, as follows:

as mentioned in Resolution and Order No. 1, and due notice as required by the Ordinance and Charter of said City of Lebanon, said County of Wayne being in pursuance of said Resolution and Order, having been given by the Recorder by posting notices in three public places of said City - a copy of which said notice is as follows, to wit:

A Resolution, signed by Councilman Bayle, was adopted, requesting the Pacific Fire Insurance Union to reduce the rates of insurance in Lebanon, Or., owing to the fact that the City has lately been provided with an efficient fire service. A copy of said Resolution was ordered sent to said Union.

Ordinance Bill No. , relating to protection of the City water-works - Electric Light works etc. read First Time. It was moved and seconded that said Ordinance Bill be read Second Time by Teller, members voting as follows:

The Bill was then upon read the Second Time by Teller. It was then, by motion, referred to the Ordinance Committee.

It was moved & carried by unanimous vote that the test, heretofore made, in the presence of the members of the Council and the Lebanon Electric Light & Water Company, on the 10<sup>th</sup> day, 1893, was satisfactory to the Council; that the said system be accepted and approved; that the pay therefor begin, as per contract, from or after after Aug. 10<sup>th</sup> 1893; and that the said Company be notified in writing of this action of the Council.
