

Council Chamber, Lebanon, Ch.
Sept. 4th 1894

Council met in regular session, the Mayor in the Chair. The roll was called and all members were present, except Councilman Kellenburger.

The minutes of the meeting of Aug. 7th last were read, and their approval deferred until the next regular meeting, as some omissions had been made.

The Marshal reported, in writing, that he had taken up two strays - since his last report, one of which was re-claimed and the other was sold. Report was accepted & filed.

It was moved by Councilman Rice and carried, that the Ordinance Committee, with the assistance of the City Attorney, prepare & present to the Council, an Ordinance requiring the Recorder and Marshal to pay to the Treasurer any money belonging to the City in their hands, without deducting fees of officers and other charges - and requiring officers & parties claiming fees to present their claims in the regular order of bills against the City.

The petition of F. L. Carner et als, praying the Council to forbid cows & other stock from running in the streets at night, was, upon motion of Councilman Rice laid on the table, Mr. Rice objecting to the petition on the ground that the petition failed to allege that the signers were citizens of Lebanon, and only alleged that the signers were residents of Lewis County. - Mess. Myers & Andrews voting no.

and Mess. Rice, Colton & Reed voting
yes.

Mr. Rice moved and adopted the
acceptance by the Council of the
repairs made by the Tribune Electric
Light and Water Company to the
streets heretofore disarranged by them,
and the said repairs were accepted
from S. W. Corner of Ash & Main Street
to a point on Main Street directly
opposite the City Hall.

The City Attorney asked instructions
from the Council as to their wishes
in regard to proceedings against
youths who broke windows and pro-
miscuously used stung shots in
the city. The Marshall was instructed
to catch and arrest the offenders and
jail them for a while, if necessary to
bring them before the Mayor,
who was asked to give the youths
a lecture, in hopes that it would
not be necessary to further pun-
ish said offenders.

Marshall was requested to ascertain
and report to the Council what disposi-
tion had been made of the 15th of
Sept brought of G. Citron in July last.
The following bills were allowed, the rules
being suspended, and warrants
ordered drawn:
