

Council Chambers Sept 18th - 94
 Present the Hon B. Montague Mayor
 and Councilmen Rice, Cotton, Myers
 Reed and Kellenberger Absent Councilman
 Andrews.

The Minutes of the Last regular
 meeting and those of August 7th
 1894 were read and approved.

The Ordinance Committee was
 granted until the next regular meet-
 ing in which to prepare the
 Ordinance relative to the fees of
 Officers

The Marshall reported that the
 15[#] of rope purchased of G. W. Cruson
 was in the hands of Councilman
 Kellenberger who being there and
 there present admitted he had it.

Under the head of New Business Joel
 Mayer made a proposition to the
 Council that the Saloons would
 take out license next month at
 the rate of \$400⁰⁰ yearly payable
 in advance and intimated that
 unless an arrangement of this kind
 could be entered into - the Saloons
 would in all probability consolidate

The Ordinance Committee were then
 upon motion ordered to prepare
 an Ordinance fixing the Saloon
 License at \$400 ^{for 300⁰⁰ for six months} yearly payable in
 advance and report at such time
 as this meeting shall be adjourned
 to. The vote on this motion stood
 Rice, yes, Cotton, no, Kellenberger, yes.

Reed, yes, Myers, yes;
 The Motion was Carried
 Councilman asked that the City Council
 consider the proposition of Employing an
 expert to ascertain the value of Electric
 Light & Water plant with a view to
 purchasing the same or if an
 expert was by the Council considered
 an unnecessary expense to ask the
 present owner to allow the Council
 to examine the Books & assets of
 expenditure in order to ascertain
 its original cost.

It was then suggested that the
 Recorder be instructed to notify
 Mr Rawlings the Present Owner
 of said plant to meet the Council
 if convenient on Friday night
 Sept 28th 94 then and there to
 present to the Council any proposition
 he might have.

It was then moved and carried that
 that this Meeting be adjourned until
 Monday evening at 7³⁰ o'clock Sept
 24th 1894.

An amendment was agreed upon by the mover & his second that the 3

lights to be dispensed with - should
be as follows to wit:

The one at or near the residence
of Jos Elkins

The one at the Odd fellows
Corner and the one at the
Corner of Main and Grant Sts
Upon the roll call the vote
coming up now on the original
motion

The motion was carried

It was then moved and carried
that the Recorder be instructed to

be graded under the supervision
of the Com on Sts & Public Property
at an expense not to exceed \$1500
