

Recorder's Office Lebanon Or.
Dec. 25, 1895.

Present Mayor, M. A. Miller and
Councilmen Bilyeu, Myers, Rice
and Dalgleish, Absent Councilmen
Long and Kellenberger.

Mayor Miller stated that the
object of this meeting is to see
what steps if any can be
taken to prevent the spread of
Scarlet fever and diphtheria now
prevalent among us.

The Recorder was then called
upon to read and did read the
Ordinance relating to contagious
diseases.

Councilman Rice as chairman
of the committee on health and
police said he was in favor of
strictly enforcing the Ordinance
in every case where the Ordinance
would cover.

The Marshal was then notified to
arrest parties violating any
quarantine whether he saw them
while away from the house or
not.

The Marshal was further ordered
to notify Mr. Frank McKerson that
he could leave his house and
board elsewhere if he desired but
if he stayed at home he would
have to observe the quarantine
regulations.

Moved and carried that the
executive officer strictly enforce
the Ordinance relating to Contagious
diseases.

Moved and carried that we do
now adjourn.
