

Council Chamber, Lebanon, Or.

Dec. 1, 1896

Present Mayor Chas. E. Rugh and
Councilmen Dalglish, Baker, Humphrey,
Smith, Beaman and Wallace.

Minutes of the previous meeting were
read and approved.

The Committee on accounts and expenses
made a verbal report in which they
recommended that the bill of Jos. Elkins
be allowed and that the bill of M. A.
Miller be not allowed.

Moved and carried that the report be
accepted and placed on file.

S. M. Garland then stated that with the
consent of the Mayor he had borrowed
30 pieces of sidewalk lumber 16ft X 8in X 1 1/2in
and that he was ready to pay for the same
or return the lumber as soon as possible.

Moved and carried that the matter of returning
or paying for the lumber be referred to the
Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Moved and carried that all bills
read except bill of M. A. Miller be allowed
and warrants drawn on the treasurer
for the several amounts as follows:

Mayor Rugh then stated that Mr. Hughes
at the request of the business men of the
City had put in some small lights in
the back alleys for the benefit of the City.

Moved and carried that the Council extend a vote of thanks to Mr. Hughes for the kindness shown the City.

Mr. Hughes then responded with a few well chosen words.

Chief of P. D. then appeared before the Council and asked the privilege of repairing some hose at a small expense.

Moved and carried that Mr. Hoper be granted the privilege of repairing the hose and that he be instructed to bring in his bill for same.

Mr. J. B. Hoper then appeared before the Council and asked that the Council grant him a "skating rink" license for our quarter at a reduced rate.

Moved and carried that Mr. Hoper be granted a license for a skating rink for our quarter for \$10.00.

Councilman Smith then stated that Mr. J. H. P. Hoper wished for the Council to put in a cross-walk at his place of business on main street. The matter was discussed by the Council but no action taken.

Councilman Wallace then stated that a cross walk across bridge Avenue at the Baptist Church would be a great accommodation to people living down bridge Ave. who attend the Baptist church.

Moved and carried that the matter of putting in a cross-walk at the Baptist Church be referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Moved and carried that we do now adjourn.
