Lebanon Or Nov. 1st 1904
 Council called to order by Mayor B. Burton
 Roll Call showed all City Councilmen
 present ~~also~~ City Attorney, Recorder,
 Treasurer and City Marshal.

Minutes of previous meeting read and
 approved.

Petition for Telephone Franchise was
 presented by J. W. Wilson asking for
 Franchise in favor of the Rock Hill
 Farmers Mutual Telephone Co.

The same was read by City Recorder
 and on motion the same was referred
 to the Committee on Ordinances,

on motion duly made and carried
 the City Council appointed
 J. R. Smith, S. O. Wallace and J. M. Stok
 as Judges of the coming City Election
 and Geo. Randall and D. C. Turner a
 Clerks of said Election

On motion city marshal was inst-
 ructed to build a cross walk from the
 N. E. Corner of the Property owned by the M. C.
 Church, North on Park street to the Property
 owned by J. C. Booth, also to build a cross
 walk one plank wide on main street
 from the Property owned by Mrs W. H. Hale
 to East side of main street.

On motion J. B. Springer was appo-
 inted a special committee of One to
 investigate as to evidence as to Saloon
 keepers allowing minors in their place of
 Business, also as to the saloons keeping
 open on Sunday, and if good evidence
 could be procured to refer the same to
 the City Attorney"

W. E. Chaddler was present and

asked the City Council permission to allow his galvanized iron, double stove pipe to remain in the Milinery department of his store till later in the fall,

On motion the City Council decided to wait till next regular meeting to act on the request of Mr Chandler,

On motion duly made and carried the following resolution was adopted

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, The income of the City of Lebanon, Oregon, from taxes, fines and licenses other than saloon licenses, and from all other sources, is wholly inadequate to meet the current expenses of the city government carefully economically administered, and to pay the interest on its out-standing indebtedness,

Whereas, The City is now paying the highest tax-levy authorized by its charter,

Whereas, The indebtedness of the city is annually increasing with the possibility of a greater increase annually hereafter,

Therefore, be it **RESOLVED**, That the Mayor of the City appoint a committee of three citizens of the City to take the necessary steps to have the next Legislature so amend the Charter of the City as that the City Council will have authority to make a tax-levy sufficiently high to provide the means for paying the current expenses and the interest on the out-standing indebtedness, and to provide a sinking fund for the payment of the out-standing indebtedness.
