

## City Council Chamber

Lebanon, Or. Dec. 19<sup>th</sup> 1905

Council called to order by Mayor B. Burdeshaw.

Roll call showed all city officers present except Councilman Henrich and City Treasurer.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

On motion duly made and carried the following Resolution was passed upon the calling of the Roll as follows:

P. M. Scroggin Voting yes for passage of resolution as well as J. B. Springer B. A. Millsap S. R. Clapp and A. M. Wilson Henrich being absent.

Resolution, The Rock Hill Farmers Mutual Telephone Company has duly petitioned the City Council of the City of Lebanon, Linn County, Oregon, for permission to sell an interest in its poles, wires, switch board and appliances within the said City to other independent telephone lines now operating and those that may hereafter operate within said City, and Whereas, The City Council of said City desires to encourage the development of all telephone lines in and about said City,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Rock Hill Farmers Mutual Telephone Company, aforesaid, be and said Company is hereby given permission to sell unto any other independent Telephone line now operating within said City, and to such other independent lines as may hereafter operate within said City, such interest or rights in

its poles, wires, Switch-board and appliances as the said The Rock Hill Farmers' Mutual Telephone Company may desire to sell; and such like permission to sell is hereby given to all said Companies that may become purchasers from the first said Company, but the permission herein granted shall not release first said Company, nor any Company to which it may sell nor any Company to which said Company may sell, from any other restriction, requirements or duty specified in the franchise heretofore granted to first said Company.

Presented and passed by the City Council in regular meeting this 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1905, by unanimous vote upon calling the Roll,

W. C. Peterson

Recorder of the City of Lebanon,

Petition of Bogard & Stum

asking that an ordinance be passed allowing the riding of Bicycles on the Side walks with proper restrictions, was by unanimous vote disallowed.

Ordinance Bill No. 64 was then introduced and there being no objection offered, the Bill was read the first time by direction of the Mayor.

There being no objection offered, the Bill was read the first time upon the first

reading of the Bill, the Mayor stated that the Bill might be read the second time now by title only, by unanimous consent, upon the question "shall the Bill be read the second now by title only?"

The Council voted as follows,

B. A. Millsap S. R. Claypool, A. M.  
Wilson (Henrich absent)

The Bill was then read the second time by title only.

"Thereupon, the Mayor stated"

"This is the second reading of the Ordinance Bill, It is now ready for commitment or amendment in order for a Third Reading" shall the Bill be read the third time now?

It was then moved that the Bill be read the third time now and was carried by the following vote:

The Bill was then read for the third time,

"Thereupon the Mayor stated"  
"shall the Bill Pass?"

"Thereupon the Mayor stated"  
"shall the title of the Bill stand, as the title of the Ordinance?"

The following vote was likewise had.

 B. A. Millsep, S. R. Clappool  
 A. M. Wilson (Henrich absent)

The Ordinance as passed was then  
 passed to the Mayor by the Recorder,  
 whereupon it was duly signed by the  
 Mayor and Recorder.
