

City Council Chamber,

Lebanon Oregon Aug 21, 1906.

City Council called to order at 8:15 P.M. by Mayor J. D. Smith.

Roll was called with the following results:-

Present Mayor J. D. Smith, Councilmen F. M. Scroggin, J. R. Claypool, J. A. Hurick, J. M. Crandall & C. W. Bogart Recorder Geo H Randle, Treasurer W. H. Hodson, Marshal A. M. Wilson, City Atty Sam M. Gosland & City Physician F. J. Laird.
Absent Councilman E. Bosler.

Minutes of last regular meeting read and being no objections or corrections were approved as read.

Councilman Claypool, Chairman of the Committee on Roads & Streets reported that he had done nothing with reference to building Hose Cart House as instructed at the last regular meeting. It was thereupon moved and carried that the Marshal and Chairman Claypool Erect or cause to be erected such building as the property owners on whose property it was built as would be suitable to the owners of the property. Carried and so ordered. Chairman Claypool also stated that the lumber belonging to the City used for Bridge work had been replaced by contract for an equal amount, and that the same would be replaced at once.

The Reports of the Treasurer and of the City Recorder were read by the Recorder and by motion referred to the Committee on accounts and current expenses.

The Treasurer again inquired regarding the Warrants for Lighting of the City, the same being supposed to draw 8% whereas he had been paying only 6% interest on the same. Upon conclusive evidence that said Warrants should

draw 8% interest it was moved and carried that the Treasurer be instructed to pay the back interest on the Warrants out of the City Funds.

James Buttershaw handed in remonstrance about the amount of his warrant, it being for only \$22 whereas his bill had been put in, as he supposed for \$250. No action was taken on the matter, and it was laid on the table by order of the Mayor till next meeting.

Under Third Reading of Ordinance Bills the Committee asked for further time to report so by motion the bills were re-referred to the Ordinance Committee.

Dr. Laird reported a Closet in the rear of the old Senate Saloon building as being in a very bad condition. No action was taken in the matter, it being left in the hands of the Committee on Health & Police. Contract from "Fabric Fire Hose Co. by A & Long" read and by motion Mayor and Recorder were instructed to sign the same for and in the name of the City of Lebanon.

Resignation of City Recorder Geo H Raulle was read and placed on file. Moved and carried that action on the matter be delayed till the next regular meeting.

The following Bills were presented and by motion allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the Treasurer for the several amounts.
