

City Council Chamber

Lebanon, Ore., Sept. 4, 1906.

Council called to order at 8:45 P.M. by Mayor J. D. Smith.

Roll call was as follows:— Mayor, J. D. Smith, present; Councilmen— S. R. Claypool, present; P. M. Scroggin, absent; J. A. Henrich, present; J. M. Crandall, present; E. Boslor, present; CW Bogart present; City Recorder, Geo H Randle, present; City Treasurer, W. E. Hardin, absent; City Marshal, A. M. Wilson present; City Atty. J. M. Gordon, absent; Physicians & Health Officer, F. J. Laird, absent.

Minutes of last regular meeting read and approved as read.

Under unfinished business, the communication of J. M. Burtinshaw was laid on the table till the next meeting of the Council.

Moved by CW Bogart & seconded by J. M. Crandall that the resignation of Geo H Randle as City Recorder be accepted, the same to take place at the close of this meeting. Carried and so ordered.

Moved by Mr. Bogart, seconded by Mr. Claypool that Ordinance Bill no 68 be laid on the table. Moved by Mr. Claypool and seconded by Mr. Bogart that the vote on the above question be by call of the roll. Carried. The Roll call was responded to as follows:— P. M. Scroggin, absent; S. R. Claypool, yes; J. A. Henrich, yes; J. M. Crandall, yes; E. Boslor, yes; CW Bogart yes. The bill was thereupon laid on the table.

Under the head of New Business it was stated by the Marshal that Mr. H. Stryker wants the passageway between the building he occupies and the old Senate Saloon building, closed. The matter was discussed and decided to leave it in the hands of Mr. Stryker.

Moved by Mr. Crandall and seconded by Mr. Bogart that the owner of the site where the Flour Mill stood be notified by the Marshal to clean up at once or steps will be taken to have the same done. Carried and so ordered.

The next matter to come before the Council was the Election of a Recorder to fill out the unexpired term of Geo H Randle whose resignation had been accepted. It was moved by Mr. Claypool and seconded by Mr. Bosler that we proceed to elect a recorder by Ballot without nominations Carried, and the Mayor appointed J. M. Crandall as Teller to assist the Recorder. The ballot was taken as follows: -

G. Lovell received one and Geo W. Cruson four, therefore the Mayor declared G. W. Cruson the duly elected recorder to fill the unexpired term. The City Recorder issued Certificate of Election to Mr. G. W. Cruson and gave him the oath of office, he to enter his duties on Wednesday Sept 5th 1902.
