

## Council Chamber,

Lebanon, November 19 - 1907.

Council meet in regular session with S. P. Bach, Mayor in the chair.

All City officers present except Councilmen F. J. Powell and C. W. Bogart.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Councilman Ralston reported verbally that he and the Recorder Cruson, had distributed the proposed new Charter, leaving one at every house in town where there were voters.

Street-Commissioner Ralston reported that Mr. W. W. Smith had been digging some ditches in the streets and after some discussion, the Mayor instructed the Street Committee to have the ditches filled up.

The Council then by motion instructed the Mayor to appoint three Judges and two Clerks of Election to serve at the regular City Election to be held on the second day of Dec. 1907. The Mayor appointed as such Judges and clerks, Geo. W. Rice, Byron Middleals and W. C. Peterson, as Judges and W. E. Hardin and J. M. Burtushaw as Clerks.

The Mayor was authorized to call a Mass-meeting to be held on Wednesday evening Nov. 27<sup>th</sup> for the purpose of discussing the proposed new City Charter. Atty. Newport reported that he had had a conference with some of the R.R. officials in regard to the new Depot to be built there, and also in the matter of Street Crossings, and that they talked very favorably and were willing to comply with the requests of the City.
