

City Council Chambers,  
Lebanon, Aug. 18<sup>th</sup> 1908

Council called to order by Mayor J. C. Mayer.

Roll call showed all officers present with the exception of Treasurer H. Y. Kirkpatrick and Health officer J. H. Jones.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

The Committee on X walks reported that they had let the contract for building X walks to Wm. Robinson at the following prices per foot; -  
thirteen wide X walks @ \$2<sup>75</sup>/<sub>100</sub> each the bal. at \$2<sup>50</sup>/<sub>100</sub> each.

Ordinance Bill No 83 - Ordinance No - was introduced and there being no objection offered the Bill was then read the first time. There being no objection offered upon the first reading of the Bill the Mayor stated that the Bill might be read the second time now by title only, upon Roll call the Council voted as follows (yes) J. M. Grandall, C. H. Green, J. R. Green, W. S. Hephner, C. H. Ralston, F. S. Powell. The Bill was then read the second time by title only.

The City Attorney was instructed to serve S. P. Hansard with a written notice to put in a new side walk within ten days on the <sup>North</sup> side of his property on the south side of Ash Street between Main & Park St. On motion being made and duly seconded and carried it was ordered that the property owners on the East and West side of Main St. from Maple Street South to Ash Street North (who had not put new cement walks down) and Hickpatrick & Alexander, on their property on the South side of Sherman Street between Main and Second St. be ordered to put new regulation cement side

walk down by the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1902.  
 After a general discussion it was ordered that  
 the grading of Main St, Third St, and ~~Fourth~~  
 Street West of the Railroad track, and ~~Fourth~~<sup>Crane</sup>  
 Street, be done as soon as possible, also to make  
 such repairs as needed.

On Motion being made, seconded and duly carried  
 Mr C. H. Ralston was appointed to superintend the  
 grading, grading let. of streets @ \$2<sup>00</sup> per day.  
 On Motion being made and carried it was ordered  
 that the City donate \$40<sup>00</sup> to assist in finishing  
 up the well and water trough against the O. F. Hall  
 and warrant ordered drawn in favor H. D. Hepburn  
 for same, and if above amount be more than is required  
 to finish the job the balance to be refunded to the City.

The following Bills having been O. H. D.  
 by the committee on account of current expenses  
 was read and on motion allowed, and warrant  
 ordered drawn on Treasurer to pay the same,  
 General Fund, H. D. Hepburn \$40<sup>00</sup> H. M.  
 Newport, \$5<sup>00</sup>, Streets & Road Fund, A. Mudgett \$4<sup>00</sup>  
 J. J. Pitchford \$1<sup>00</sup> S. M. Garland \$5<sup>00</sup>  
 Lebanon Lumber Co. \$326<sup>91</sup>/<sub>100</sub>
