### New Business

Upon Motion being made, duly seconded and carried  
the City Attorney was ordered to begin proceedings to open ~~the~~  
Williams St, from Sherman to Grant, through the property of  
Mr E. M. Bodwell; Also to open Pratt Street, through the  
property of the estate of S. R. Claypool, and for a 21 foot street  
along the west side of the railroad right-of-way through  
the property of B. M. Weeks, Amy Hartens, and Mr &  
Polly A. Morris.

On Motion being made and duly carried  
the City attorney was also instructed to notify  
the following property owners to build new and  
repair their sidewalks within stated time of notice.

The City Attorney was also instructed to prepare an Ordinance by next Council meeting amending Pool Table License in effect as follows to wit; - One Table \$30<sup>00</sup> per year, Two Tables \$50<sup>00</sup> per year. Three or more Tables, \$20<sup>00</sup> each per year, all payable semi-annually in advance.
