

City Council Chambers
Lebanon Nov 16 - 1909.

Council called to order by Mayor, J. C. Mayer.

Roll call showed all officers present with the exception of Health Officer Dr. W. B. Ginnell.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

Special Committee on City Hall Site gave a verbal report on different sites inspected and on motion subject was adjourned.

Petitions

The petition asking for side walks as follows - to wit: from Oak Street to Maple St on the east side of Grove St, and from Grove St to Park St on the south side of Maple St, was granted and the property owners were to be ordered to put regulation side walk as soon as possible.

The petition asking for an arc light near to the small Bridge east of the Saw Mill of the Lebanon Lumber Co. was accepted and after discussing the matter, on Motion 2 Small light was ordered to be put ~~at~~ at the Bridge and ~~the other at~~ at ^{such} change in petition being satisfactory to the petitioners.

Ordinance Bill No 98 - Ordinance No ~~94~~ respecting fire limit and Ordinance Bill 99 - ~~Ordinance~~ No 95 placing City Treasurer, City Recorder, City Attorney, and Marshall on Flat Salary was introduced and read the first and second times, and on Motion held over until next Council night.

Two letters from the Lebanon Paper Co. was ^{read} in respect to their division line on Elm Street, and offering the 21 ft on the South Side of Street for \$2500 and after a general discussion on Motion the Mayor appointed the following to view the property and report to the City Recorder, C. H. Ralston, J. R. Green & L. H. [unclear]

The ^{appraisers} committee appointed at the regular meeting Nov 2-1909, to view and assess damages, and benefits, to owners of Property on Railroad St between Vine St and Rose St. in Lebanon, was, as follows, to wit: Damage Mrs Beemes \$65.00 Benefits to Mr Gaustens and The Morris estate, \$20.00 each also to Mrs Effie Bodwell for damages to her property on account of a street through the premises of the above named Mrs Effie Bodwell between Bridge Avenue and Sherman St. on William Street in Lebanon do and appraise and adjudge the amount of said damages to said property, to be in the amount of \$425.00. Signed S. P. Bach Chairman Lee Bilyew and B. Burtenshaw, Appraisers, was accepted, and on Motion warrants was ordered drawn on Treasurer, to pay the same when the Property Owners full fill their Part.

New Business

On Motion the City Attorney was instructed to order G. Allen and C. B. Montague to put in regulation side walk on the North Side of Sherman Street from Grove to Hiatt St. On Motion Mr Zeising was allowed to put in a cross walk on South Main Street near [unclear] property under the supervision of the St Commissioner,

The City Recorder was instructed to notify the Lebanon Band, that the Council did not wish them to use the City Hall any longer as a place to practice on.

The following judges and clerks was appointed for the regular Election of Officers to be elected for the ensuing year, to be held the first Monday in December 1909, for judges G. W. Cruson, R. R. Cunningham, and Phil Ritter, for clerks L. Rice and E. G. Morganson.

The following Bill having being O. K. D. by the committee on Current Expenses, was read and on motion allowed and warrant drawn on Treasurer to pay the same, Street Fund Lebanon Lumber Co. \$211⁰⁰.
