

Council Chamber, Lebanon Oregon.

September 29th, 1910.

The common council of the city of Lebanon met in regular session in the city hall in said city on this the 29th day of September, 1910 this being the time and place for holding the regular session of the said council. Mayor A. M. Reeves being present and presiding, and all councilmen being present and in their places.

The minutes of the last regular meeting of the council were read and approved as read.

The petition of A. I. Crandall asking that the Oregon and California railroad co. be allowed to put in a lever switch in Oak street at a point about 50 feet west of Main street on the south side of the present track for a switch to the new planer was by a resolution duly made, and carried.

The petition of A. F. Bakrke for a fire hydrant at Grant and Fourth street and one at Grant and 6th street was read was amended so as to read Sherman street instead of Grant and was allowed and fire hydrants were ordered to be put in at the the S. E. corner of the intersection of Grant and 4th street and Grant and 6th street.

Councilman W. O. McClain introduced and offered a resolution to submit the the voters of the city of Lebanon at the general election to be held in the said city on the 5th day of December, 1910 a proposition to amend the charter of the said city by repealing Section 106, 107 108 109 110, 111 112 113 114 115 116 and 117, and to amend section 105 of the present charter of the said city, which said resolution was as follows.

On the reading of the resolution it was moved by Councilman McClain and duly seconded by councilman I. M. Crandall, that the resolution be adopted, and on the roll being called for an aye and no vote the vote was as follow. those voting yes Councilmen S. P. Bach, I. M. Crandall J. C. Mayer, W. O. McClain, and J. L. Underwood, and those Voting No. C. H. Ralston, . There being five voting for the adoption of the resolution and one voting against it. thereupon the mayor declared the resolution duly adopted and passed.

Whereupon the mayor duly signed the said resolution as approved which was duly attested by the recorder.

The following are the amendments to the said charter as proposed by the said resolution as passed and approved by the said council.

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Councilman W. O. McClain offered and introduced a resolution ~~to accept~~ for the city of Lebanon to accept the new deed from Mary Belle Elkins and husband was read and on Motion of Mr. McClain duly seconded the resolution was adopted. which resolution was as follows.

Application of N. M. Newport for a duplicate warrant for Warrant no 62 dated Oct 7, 1908 for \$12.50 issued to him which had been lost was granted and new warrant ordered issued to him for the amount of \$12,50 on his giving to the city an obligation to be approved by the mayor to hold the city harmless against the lost warrant..

No further business coming before the council the council adjourned to meet at the regular session Oct. 4th.

# RESOLUTION

Be it resolved, by the City Council of the City of Lebanon, that an Act entitled "An Act to repeal Sections 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116 and 117; and to amend Section 105 of an Act entitled "A Bill to propose by initiative by resolution of the Council of the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, to provide for a charter for the City of Lebanon and to define the powers thereof, to provide for the issuing of bonds and to provide for issuing bonds to refund present indebtedness, and to repeal an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate

the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 20, 1891, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereof," adopted and approved by a majority vote of the legal voters of said City at the general election, held in said City on December 2, 1907, and duly proclaimed by the Mayor of the said City of Lebanon Oregon, to be the charter of said City, now in full force and effect," be and the same is hereby submitted to the legal voters of the City of Lebanon at the regular city election to be held on Monday, the 5th day of December, 1910, for their adoption or rejection, and each elector who votes upon said proposed amendment shall vote "yes" or "no" in answer to the following question: "Shall the Charter of the City of Lebanon be amended by amending Section 105 and repealing Sections 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116 and 117?"

Adopted by the Council and filed in the office of the City Recorder on the 20th day of September, 1910.

# Charter Amendment

SUBMITTED BY THE COUNCIL

## AN ACT

To repeal Sections 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116 and 117; and to amend Section 105, of an Act entitled "A Bill to propose by initiative by resolution, the Council of the City of Lebanon in Linn present Oregon, to provide for issuing bonds to refund present indebtedness, and to repeal an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 20, 1891, and "to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereof," adopted and approved by a majority vote of the legal voters of said City at the general election held in said City on December 2, 1907, and duly proclaimed by the Mayor on December 6, 1907, to be the charter of said City, now in full force and effect.

Section 1. That Sections 106, 107, 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 117, of an Act entitled "A Bill to propose by initiative resolution of the Council of the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, to provide for a Charter for the City of Lebanon and to define the powers thereof, to provide for the issuing of bonds to refund present indebtedness, and to repeal an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 20, 1891, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereof," be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 2. That Section 105 of an act entitled "A Bill to propose by initiative by resolution of the Council of the City of Lebanon, in Linn County, Oregon, to provide for a charter for the City of Lebanon and to define the powers thereof; to provide for the issuing of bonds and to provide for issuing bonds to refund present indebtedness," and to repeal an Act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of

Lebanon, in Linn County, State of Oregon, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith," filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 20 1891, and to repeal all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereof, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

"Section 105 The City Council of the City of Lebanon is hereby granted the power and authority, and is hereby required in the name of the said City, to incur an indebtedness to an amount not to exceed Seventy Thousand Dollars, for the purpose of acquiring rights and rights-of-way for and to construct, establish, install, operate and maintain a sewerage system for said City; and to issue and dispose of bonds of the said City of Lebanon, in the name and under the corporate seal of said City of Lebanon, to an amount not to exceed Seventy Thousand Dollars.

The bonds issued in pursuance of the authority hereby granted, shall be known and designated on their face as "Sewer Bonds-Series A," and shall be of the denominations of \$100.00, \$500.00 or \$1,000.00 as the City Council may elect with interest coupons attached thereto. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the City Recorder of said City of Lebanon, and each of said coupons shall have the signatures of the Mayor and City Recorder of the said city engraved thereon, whereby the City of Lebanon shall be held and considered in substance and effect to undertake and promise, in consideration of the premises, to pay to the bearer of each said bonds at maturity the sum named therein in gold coin of the United States, together with interest thereon, payable semi-annually in like gold coin, at the rate of interest therein named. Said bonds shall bear interest not to exceed six per cent per annum, and shall be advertised and sold to the highest responsible bidder. The Council may, at its discretion, reject any and all bids tendered for such bonds, and may proceed to re-advertise and sell the same when bids are not satisfactory. Said bonds shall be payable in ten, twenty or thirty years, as the Council may determine; and if the bonds are made payable in thirty years, they shall contain a clause making it optional with the City of Lebanon to pay off said bonds, or any of them, at any time after twenty years from the date of such bonds, and prescribe the notice to be given by said City of Lebanon to the holders of such bonds of its intention to pay the same.

The City Council of said city shall have power and it is hereby authorized and directed to provide for the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds.

The said bonds shall not be sold for less than their face value."
