

Lebanon, Oregon, Council Chambers, August 31st, 1911

Council met in regular adjourned session, in the City Council Chambers, at 8:00 o'clock, P.M., that being the time and place for the regular adjourned meeting of the Council pursuant of adjournment of August 29, 1911, with Mayor Am M. Reeves in the Chair presiding. The roll call showed all members, elected to the Council, present and in their places except Councilman J. L. Underwood, who was absent.

The Mayor announced this the time and place for considering the bids for the sale of the \$70,000.00 issue of the Sewer Bonds of the City of Lebanon pursuant to the adjournment of the Council on Aug. 29th, 1911.

Resolution No. 10 was introduced by Councilman C. H. Kalston and was read. It was moved by Councilman C. H. Kalston and seconded by Councilman I. M. Grandall that the Resolution be adopted. Upon roll being called for the passage of the Resolution, and the aye and nay vote being taken, the vote was as follows:

The same having received the affirmative vote of the majority of all members elected to the Council, taken by aye and nay vote, the Mayor announced and declared that the Resolution was duly passed and adopted; and thereupon the Mayor signed the Resolution, which Resolution was as follows:

RESOLUTION - No. 10.

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Lebanon, Oregon, Aug. 31, 1911.

WHEREAS: At a regular adjourned meeting of the City Council, held on the evening of Tuesday, August 29th, 1911, the same being the time for the opening of the bids for the sale of the Sewer Bonds, heretofore duly advertised, there being present and presiding the Mayor and, there being present and voting, all members of the Council, the bids received were opened and were as follows:

- (1) Union Trust and Savings Bank of Spokane, Washington, par and accrued interest and \$2.70 per \$1000.00 premium and the payment of the costs of preparing the bonds.
- (2) J. H. Causey and Co. of Denver, Colorado, par and accrued interest and \$75.00 gross premium on \$70,000.00, and payment of the costs of printing the bonds.
- (3) Bidwell-Haden Bros., par for \$60,000.00.

WHEREAS: the said Union Trust and Savings Bank, aforesaid, presented the highest and best bid, but attached to the Cashier's check an objectionable condition;

WHEREAS: the bid of Bidwell-Haden Bros. was possible susceptible of two different constructions, in that the bid did not clearly state whether or not the bid included the payment of the accrued interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the bid of the said Union Trust and Savings Bank be and the same is hereby accepted, but said acceptance is conditioned upon the said bidders delivering unto the Mayor a certified check on a responsible bank in the sum of \$3500.00, payable to the Mayor of Lebanon, on demand, without condition or reservation, within five days, otherwise said bid shall be rejected and said check returned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That in case the said Union Trust and Savings Bank fails to so furnish said check within said time, then and in that case, the bid of the said Bidwell-Haden Bros. be and the same is

accepted, but said acceptance is conditioned upon the said bidders furnishing the Mayor of Lebanon, within ---five--- days, satisfactory evidence that the said bidders intended and will pay all said accrued interest, otherwise said bid shall be rejected;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the bid of the said J. H. Causey & Co. be rejected and their check at once returned to them, as the bid was not the best bid and the check was not in conformity with the advertisement for bids.

Passed by the Council, August, 31st, 1911.

(After transacting some other business, not relating to the Sewer Bond Issue or bids, the Council adjourned until the next regular Meeting of the Council.)
