

Council Chambers

Lebanon Oregon November 7th 1911

The Common Council of the city of Lebanon met in regular session on this the 7th day of Nov 1911 at the council chambers at the usual hour there being present and presiding Mayor A M Prewer and all members elected to the Council being present and in their places and voting Recorder J R Green and other city officers being also present and in their places upon the Roll being called

The minutes of the last meeting of the Council was read and approved as read

Ordinance Bill No 114 the same being an Ordinance Confirming the Sale of the Sewer Bonds to the Union Trust & Savings Bank of Spokane Washington, entitled "An Ordinance Confirming the Sale and directing the issuance of Sixty Thousand (\$60,000) Dollars Sewer Bonds, Series "A" of the city of Lebanon, Oregon," was introduced by the Ordinance Committee and read the first time, there being no objections the Bill was read in full the second time upon the second reading of the bill

The Mayor stated this is the second reading of the Bill, it is now ready for commitment and amendment in order for the third reading

Upon motion of Councilman J L Underwood seconded by Councilman J M Randall and concurred by every member elected to the Council voting yes upon the roll being called and the ayes and noes being taken and entered in the Journal as follows

The Mayor announced that every member elected to the Council has voted yes in favor of the third reading of the bill at this time

Thereupon the Bill was read the third time at this meeting

After the third reading of the Bill the Mayor stated this is the third reading of the bill shall the bill pass

On Motion of Councilman J L Underwood^{ad} seconded
by Councilman C H Ralston and concurred in by every
member elected to the Council voting yes when their names
were called on the roll being called and the ayes and noes
being taken and entered in the Journal at the time as
follows

The Mayor announced that the bill had received the
unanimous vote of all the members elected to the Council
and that the bill had duly passed

After the passage of the bill the Mayor stated shall the
title of the bill stand as the title to the ordinance

Upon Motion of Councilman J M Brandall seconded
by Councilman J S Northrup, and concurred in by
every member elected to the Council taken by ayes and
noes votes as his name was called yes the vote being entered
at the time in the Journal as follows

The Mayor announced that every member elected
to the Council had voted in favor of the title to the
bill standing as the title to the ordinance

The Mayor announced that the title to the bill will
stand as the title of the ordinance

The Ordinance was thereupon submitted to the
Mayor who signed the same, and the same is as
filed in the office of the Recorder.

Ordinance Bill No 115.

An Ordinance to license regulate tax
and restrain certain callings trades and
employments in the city of Lebanon
was introduced by ordinance Committee
and read the first time,

Thereupon the Mayor stated
 There being no objection offered on the first
 reading of the bill, The Mayor stated that the bill
 might be read the second time now by title only
 upon Motion of Councilman J M Brandall seconded
 by Councilman C H Ralston that the bill be read
 the second time now by title only
 upon the calling of the roll the vote was as follows

 " " J S Dordenwood (yes) J S Northrup (yes)
 " " C H Ralston (yes) B L Cotton (yes)

Thereupon the Mayor stated this is the second
 reading of the bill it is now ready for Amendment
 and amendment in order for the third reading
 the Bill was laid over until next meeting
 new Business

The following Judges and Clerks was appointed
 for the regular election of officers to be elected
 for the ensuing year to be held the first Monday
 in December 1911

For Judges C H St Johns G W Cronson & A E Geasing
 Clerks J M B Wintershaw & L A Reeves

Moved by Councilman J M Brandall seconded by
 C H Ralston the recorder was instructed to post three
 Election Notices for the city election to be held the first
 Monday in Dec 1911

on Motion made and duly seconded the Street Wash
 and Street Commissioner was discontinued for
 the present

on Motion the Light and Water Co was ordered
 to place three small lights on Sherman Street
 to be placed as follows one at the intersection of
 fourth and Sherman ^{streets} one at 5th and Sherman Streets
 and one at 6 and Sherman Streets

there being no further business on Motion
 Council adjourned subject to the call of the
 Mayor
