

Council Chambers

Lebanon Oregon December 5th 1911

The Common Council of the City of Lebanon Oregon met in a regular session at the Council Chambers at the usual hour

Council called to order by Mayor A M Reeves

Roll Call

Showed all members of the Council ^{all} present and in their places, Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read

Resolution Lebanon Oreg Dec 1st 1911

where as, the city of Lebanon believes it has many more people within its limits who are bona fide residents of the city than is given by the last federal census and the city has grown rapidly in population since the said census was taken

and whereas we believe that it is for the best interest of the said city that the election held in the said city be conducted under the Oregon primary law and Australian ballot system

and whereas in cities having a population or more than 2000 people such system is mandatory and compulsory under the laws of Oregon, and we believe that the said city now has many more population than the said 2000, and that all future elections be held and conducted under the said laws

Therefore be it resolved by the mass meeting duly called and held in the said city on the 1st day of December 1911 by the call of the Mayor to nominate a ticket to be voted on at the regular city election to be held on Dec 4th 1911

That this meeting ask and petition the city Council of Lebanon Oregon to at once cause to be taken a census and count of all the bona fide residents of the city of Lebanon and the same be made a permanent record of the said city, and that the said city Council duly enact all such measures as may be necessary and required to the end that all future elections held in the said city of Lebanon be conducted under the Oregon State laws for the direct nomination of all candidates for city officers and that all elections be held and

Conducted under the Oregon primary and Australian ballot system,

That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the city Council of Lebanon by the secretary of this meeting on motion the resolution was duly adopted and the Mayor appoint a committee of three to employ some reliable persons to take the census and count of all the bona fied residents of the city of Lebanon,

whereupon the Mayor appointed C H Ralston J L Underwood and B L Cotton on said committee

Resolution No 13

was introduced and read

Resolved by the Council That from and after this date the services of Messrs Walker and Meager as Consulting Engineers in connection with the proposed Sewer System for the city of Lebanon, shall be no longer required and the City Recorder is hereby directed to forthwith notify Messrs Walker and Meager of this action of the Council, Dated this 5th day of December 1911

upon motion of Councilman C H Ralston seconded by Councilman J S Northrup, ^{that the Resolution be adopted as read} the Resolution was ^{then} duly adopted ^{upon the vote being taken} by a unanimous vote of all the Council

Ordinance Bill No 145

An Ordinance to license certain calling and trades come up for the third reading upon motion of Councilman J M Brandall, seconded by Councilman J L Underwood that the Bill be read the third time ^{now} upon the roll being called the vote was as follows

The Mayor then declared the title of the bill to be the title of the Ordinance

the Ordinance was then approved and signed by the Mayor and signed and attested by the Recorder

On Motion the matter of commencing work on the proposed Sewer for Lebanon, was postponed until next Spring and the Council, to determine the time for the work to begin

It was moved the Mayor appoint a Committee of three to confer with Property owners for right-aways

for the proposed Sewer and Sewer the same. Whereupon the Mayor appointed the Committee on Streets and Public Property on said Committee Mr J. Nelson was present and asked the permission of the Council to make some changes in his stand for his Peanut wagon at the corner of Main and Sherman Streets. On Motion Mr Nelsons request was granted
