Sebanon Oregon August 20th 1912

Council met in a regular meeting Mayor G. B. Wannerter being in the chair and presiding Roll call showed all members of the Council present except Councilman J. L. Hardwood minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read
 new Business:

P. M. Serzgens and L. A. Tucker appeared before the Council and asked the Council to have Oak Street filled at the railroad road crossing on Motion it was ordered that the railroad Company be notified to put in a crossing across the track on Oak and River Street

ordinance Bill No 118 ordinance 112

an Ordinance to regulate the Speed of automobiles Motor vehicles Motor cycles vehicles Engines trains cars Bicycles Carriages Street Cars and all other traveling on the streets of the city of Sebanon within the limits of the said city

was introduced by the ordinance committee, and read the first time

there being no objection offered on the first reading of the Bill the Mayor stated the Bill might be read ^{second time} by title only upon the calling of the roll the vote was as follows, J. M. Randall (yes) W. C. McBlain (yes)

J. L. Hardwood absent J. S. Northrup (yes)

N. B. Bluffhaver (yes) A. E. Giesing (yes)

the Bill was then read the second time by title only

whereupon the Mayor stated this is the second reading of the bill it is now ready for commitment or amendment in order for the third reading

upon motion ~~read~~ of councilman W. C. McBlain that the bill be read the third time now upon the calling of the Roll the vote was as follows J. M. Randall (yes) McBlain (yes)

J. L. Hardwood absent J. S. Northrup (yes)

N. B. Bluffhaver (yes) A. E. Giesing (yes)

whereupon the Mayor stated

Shall the Bill Pass upon the calling of the Roll the vote was as follows J. M. Randall (yes) McBlain (yes)

Hardwood absent Northrup (yes) Bluffhaver (yes)

Giesing (yes)

Thereupon the Mayor stated shall the title of the Bill stand as the title of the ordinance upon the calling of the Roll the vote was as follows Crandall (yes) McBlain (yes) Underwood absent. Northrop yes Keephaver yes Giesing (yes) The Mayor then declared the title of the Bill to be the title of the ordinance.
The Bill was then approved by the Mayor and attested by the Recorder

Ordinance Bill No 119 Ordinance No 113
an ordinance providing for the riding of Big wheels on the sidewalks within the city limits was introduced and read the first time there being no objection offered on the first reading of the Bill the Mayor stated that the bill might be read the second time now by title only upon the calling of the roll the vote was as follows Crandall (yes) McBlain yes Underwood absent. Northrop yes Keephaver (yes) Giesing (yes) the bill was then read the second time by title only. the bill was then laid over until the next regular meeting.

on motion the building of Mr Lovengood was ordered rented for one month to store the hoas carts in
on motion the Marshall was ordered to have lights connected to city gas

The following Bills were allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the treasurer to pay the same
