Council met in a regular meeting with Mayor V. S. Vremersten in the chair and presiding Roll call showed all members of the Council present - minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read

Pertition

asking that the sidewalk along the East side of Grove Street - and on the west side of Block 5 be extended to connect with the bridge across the channel was read on motion the petition was accepted and the work be ordered built -

Pertition signed by John Durlane and others asking for street lights on Oak Street - was read and on motion was referred to the Committee on Streets and Public Property

Ordinance Bill No 122

An Ordinance to regulate the cutting and raising of telephone and Electric light and other wires for the purpose of moving buildings was introduced and read the first time there being no objection offered on the first reading of the bill the Mayor stated that the bill might be read the second time now by title only upon the roll being called the vote was as follows

 the city of Lebanon to sign a contract with the Federal
 Construction Co for the paving of main street from A street
 to Carolina street was brought up for the third reading and
 read the third time

whereupon the Mayor stated
 shall the bill pass upon the calling of the roll the vote was as follows

 there being a majority voting in favor of the passage of the bill
 the Mayor declared the Bill duly passed

 on motion of Councilman ^{A. E.} Ziering and duly seconded by
 Councilman J. S. Northrop the following part of the sewer system
 was excited beginning at the outlet at Marks Slough
 thence south on main line of sewer to man hole on William
 and wheeler street thence southwest on wheeler street to
 main street thence southeast on line across High School
 ground to the first man hole south of Montague Street
 said street being being the street along the south line
 of High School grounds on the line running in the
 alley between Second Street and Third Street and that
 the High School building be permitted to connect with
 same at once the said motion on being put by the
 Mayor was unanimously adopted by the
 Council

on motion of Councilman A E Jaising and duly
 seconded by Councilman J S Northrop the contractor
 for the Lebanon sewer system was directed to close
 up all work now open and place the streets and
 alleys in condition for winter traffic which have
 been opened for the said sewer, which motion was
 duly adopted by the Council by unanimous vote
 City Marshal M D Davis, tendered his resignation
 as marshal.

on motion the resignation of M D Davis was accepted
 by a unanimous vote of the Council the Mayor declared
 the office of City Marshal vacant and the Council
 proceeded to elect a marshal by ballot. - N D Kuphaver
 and J L Underwood was appointed tellers, the ballot was
 taken which show the vote as follows Murgraives 5
 J R Richard 1 the Mayor declared Murgraives duly
 elected city marshal

there being no farther business to come before
 the Council on motion Council adjourned
